The number of proficient students in reading in grades 3-5 will increase from the Annual Measurable Objective (AMO) of 67% on the 2009-10 NMSBA to an (AMO) of 77% on the 2010-11 NMSBA. Based on the 2009-2010 NMSBA, 28.28% of the 3-5 students were proficient or advanced in Reading.

Math

The number of proficient students in Math in grades 3-5 will increase to the Annual Measurable Objective (AMO) of 57% on the 2009-10 NMSBA to an (AMO) of 68% on the 2010-11 NMSBA.

Based on the 2009-2010 NMSBA, 24.14% of the 3-5 students were proficient or advanced in Math.

Parent

80% of the parents of students at Dulce Elementary school will respond to the New Mexico Quality of Education survey.

Using the 2011 New Mexico Quality of Education survey, Parent responses will indicate agreement or strong agreement for 80% of the survey questions..

Parent Involvement

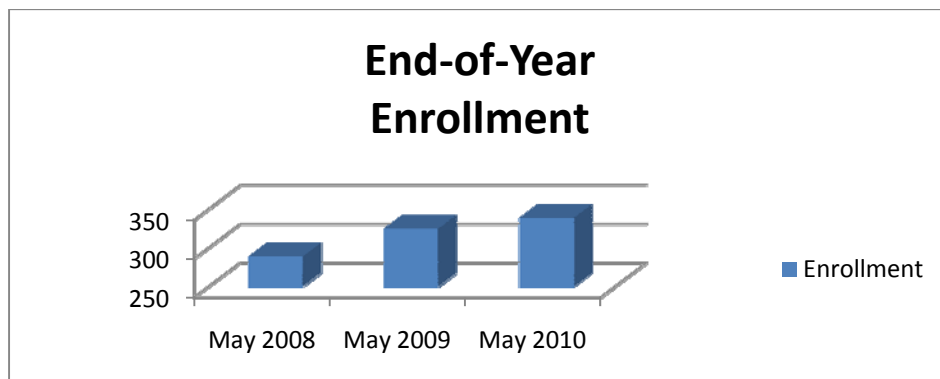

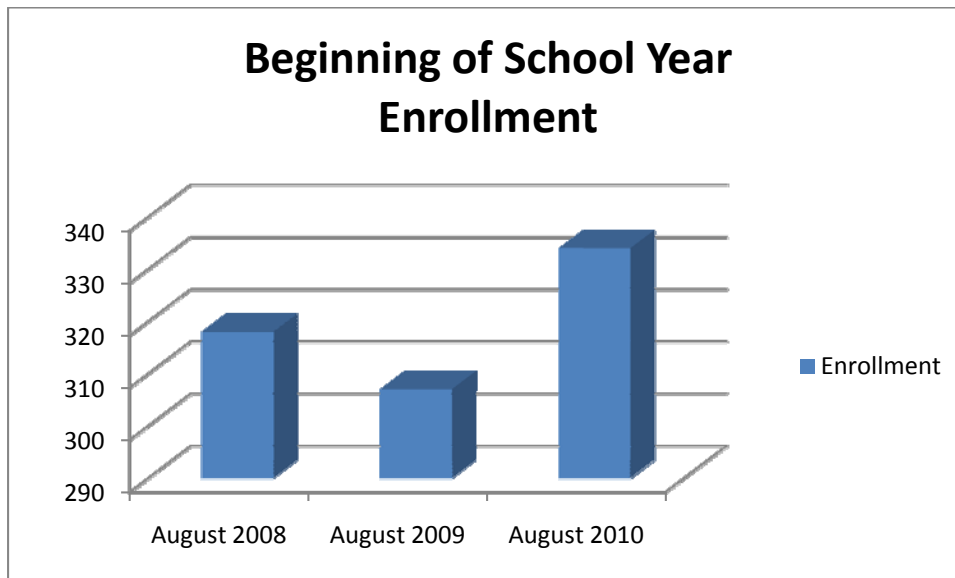

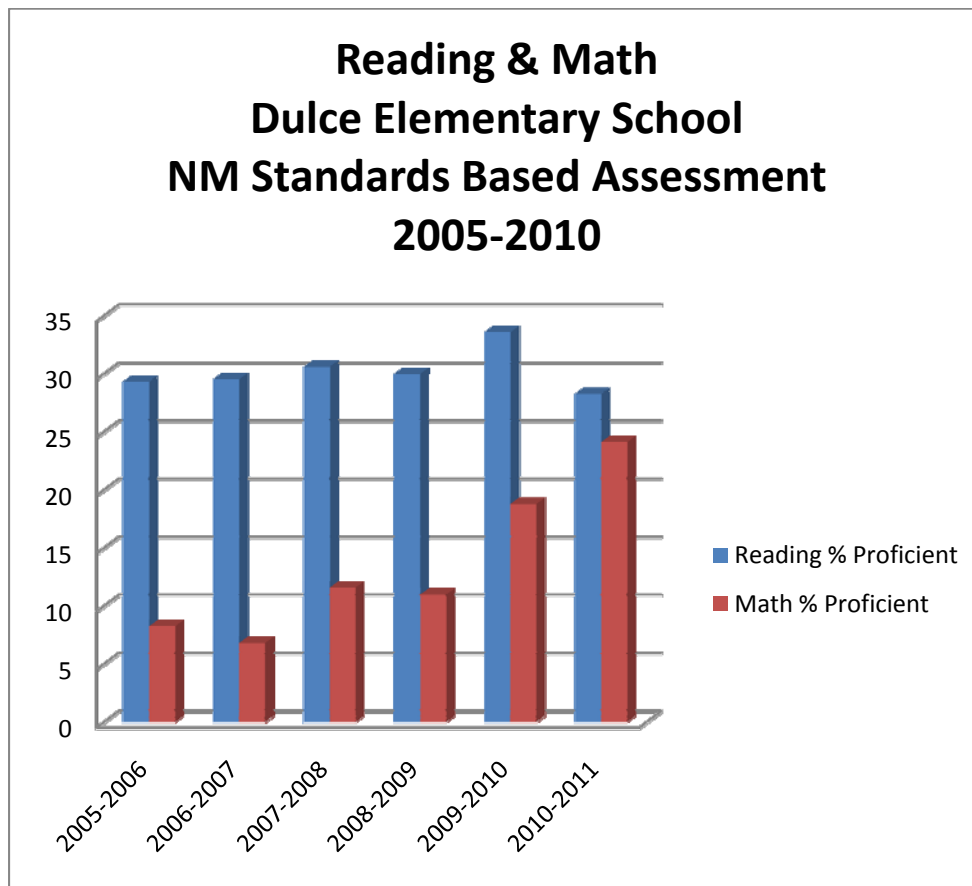

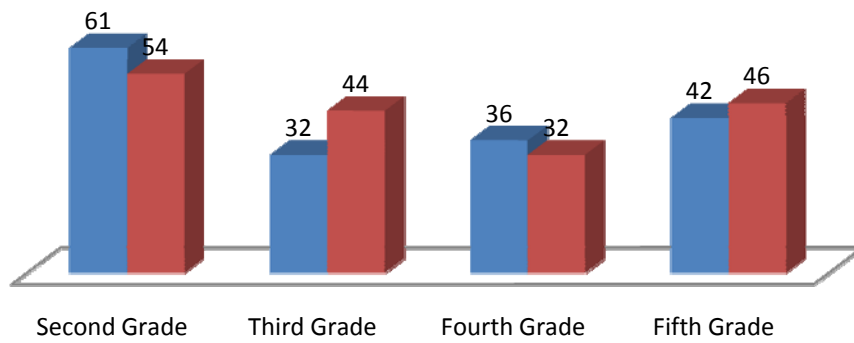


State Assessment Results



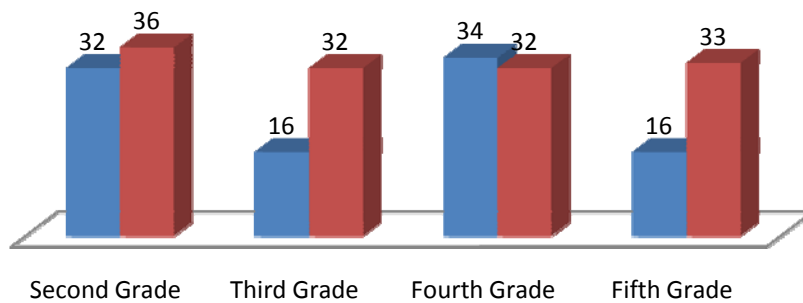
Reading NWEA MAP 2009-2010 Comparisons

■ Spring 09 ■ Spring 10

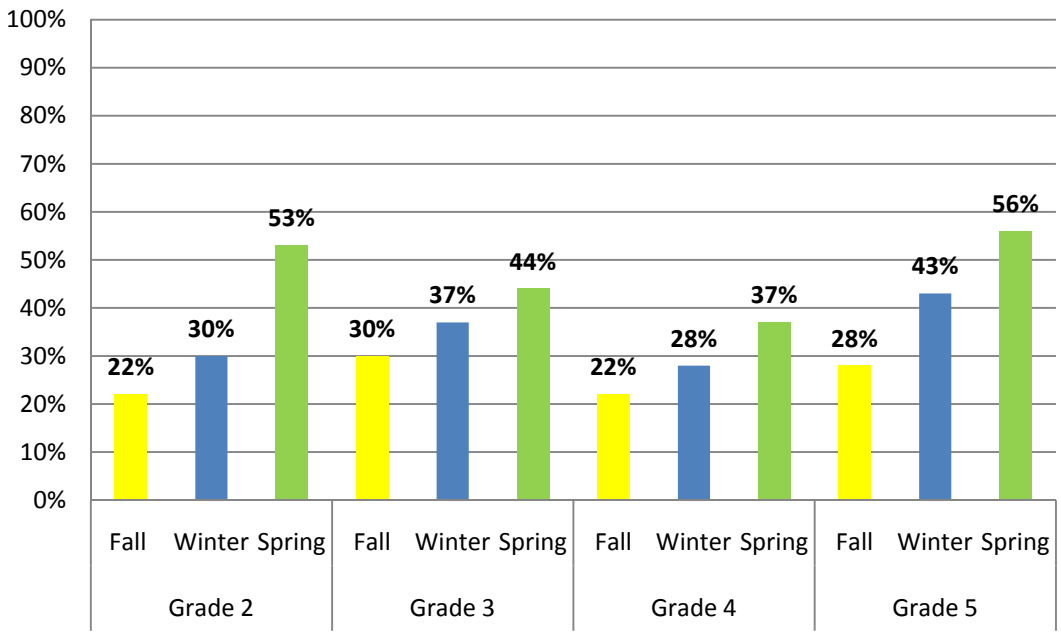


Math NWEA MAP 2009-2010 Comparisons

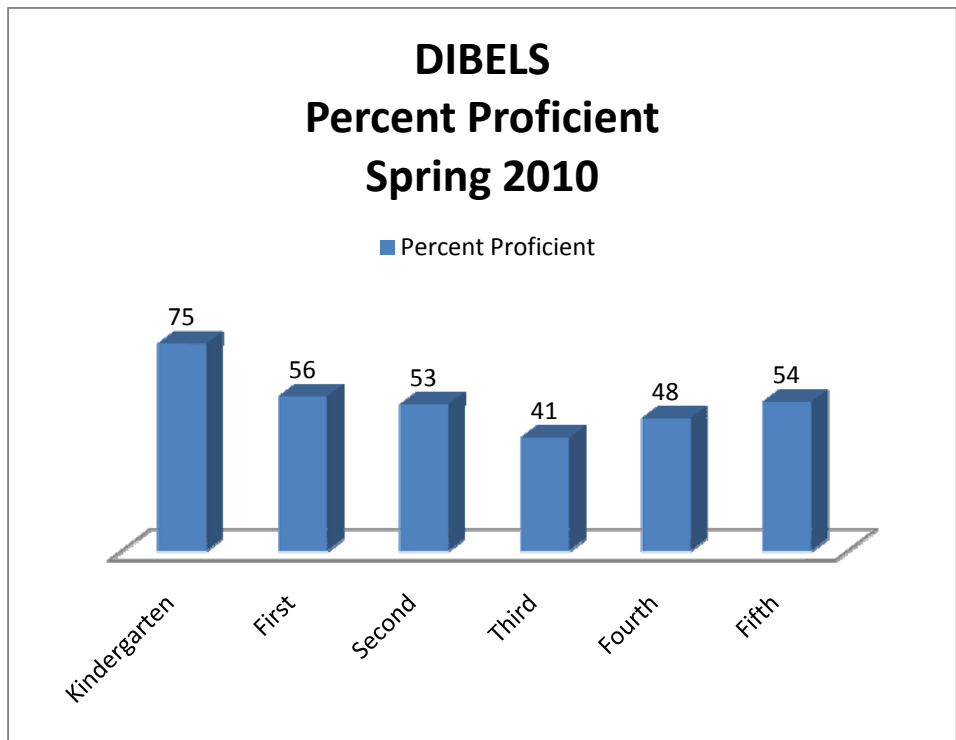
